On this **Reformation Sunday** we acknowledge that like in the days of Martin Luther, John Calvin, and other reformers, "our ancient foe" (Satan) continually tries to deceive or distract us as we seek to be followers of Jesus Christ. Pray "we will not confide in our own strength," but that instead "our hearts be strengthened by grace" (Hebrews 13: 9).

This past Monday Margaret S. experienced a mild stroke. Following a CAT Scan at the hospital in Fergus and a brief stay at the hospital in Palmerston, Margaret was transferred and admitted to Guelph General Hospital for rehabilitation therapy. Pray therapy will be effective for her left arm and left leg affected by the stroke.

After undergoing parathyroid removal surgery this past Thursday, a week ago, **Jerry H.** was finally able to return home from the hospital on Monday. We give thanks to God for a successful surgery. Pray for continual recovery and strength including relief from confusion and lower calcium levels.

We continue to pray for **Markus F.** currently in Haiti working with Empower Global on the Saint Michel Agricultural Project. Pray for safety at construction sites, willingness to learn self-sustaining agricultural practices and wisdom for evangelism including discipleship. Markus plans to return home by November 14 and will be given opportunity to provide us updates and give his own testimony.

We have been asked by our denomination, under the leadership of executive director Steven Timmermans, to pray for our brothers and sisters who are part of the RCA (Reformed Church in America). Due to deep division within this denomination, its leaders are considering three possible scenarios for the future: staying together, radical reconstitution or grace-filled separation. Pray much strength and wisdom for the Vision Group as they seek to discern how the Holy Spirit is leading and guiding them.
